### Altitude sickness on Mount Everest would have cost Elias \$10,000 without Sports & Activities Coverage

As his symptoms persisted after the descent, Elias was airlifted from base camp to a hospital in Katmandu. Doctors diagnosed him with altitude sickness and hospitalized him for four days.
